History and Social Studies, Science, and Technical Writing looks at analyzing sources, the multiple steps of research, and argumentative, informative and explanatory writing. Analyze the Emancipation Proclamation to better understand the anti-slavery debate during the Civil War, reconstruct the 1962 World's Fair through a range of resources to learn how to compare different types of communication, or practice conducting research using resources from "Jean-Michel Cousteau: Ocean Adventures." Planning, editing and revising, publishing technology, and arguing (think the "strawman fallacy") are also explored.
