DIY Heatless Lava Lamp

Materials List:

- empty 2 liter bottle
- about 2 cups of water
- food coloring
- about 5 cups of vegetable oil
- about 1 tablespoon of salt

Note: This can get messy. Cover the table/counter where you will be doing this activity. You can also place the bottle in an empty bin or over the sink to catch any liquid that spills.

Instructions:

1. Add about 2 cups of water to an empty 2 liter bottle.



2. Add a few drops of food coloring



3. Add about 5 cups of vegetable oil to the water. Don't fill it all the way to the top. Let the liquids sit in the bottle for a few minutes.



4. Add about a tablespoon of salt to the mixture. Watch what happens!

Giant Googly Eyes

Materials List:

- 2 white paper plates
- non-toxic markers
- non-toxic paint (you can also use glow-in-the-dark paint for this activity)
- paint brush

Note: In the video, Zing uses a marker and paints for this activity. You can choose to do the same or use only markers or only paint. Choose what works best for you!

Instructions:


1. Using a marker, draw a circle about the size of a quarter in the middle of one plate. Do the same thing on the 2nd plate. These will be the pupils for your eyes.



2. Dip your paintbrush in paint and paint the eye on one plate. Feel free to experiment with different colors.



3. Paint the eye color on the second plate.



4. Add some veins or glow-in-the-dark paint if you would like.



5. With the help of an adult, find a good place around your home to place the eyes.
