## A Classic Drawing Game

### Materials List:

- paper
- markers
- a partner or friend to play with

### Instructions:


1. Fold a piece of paper into thirds. Start by having the first person draw the head of the character in the top section of the paper. When finished, draw small lines into the second box so that the next person knows where to begin their drawing.



2. Fold the paper so that the top portion cannot be seen and pass it to the next person.



3. The second person should then draw the body of the character in the middle section of the paper.



4. Fold the middle section over so that the head and the body cannot be seen and pass the drawing to the next person. Without peeking, the third person should draw the legs of the character.



5. Unfold the paper and reveal the unique creature!



## Telephone Cups

### Materials List:

- plastic cups
- string
- large paperclips
- scissors

**\*This activity should be done with the help of a trusted adult\***

### Instructions:

**1. With the help of an adult, carefully use scissors to make a small hole in the bottom of each cup.**



**2. Push one end of the string through the bottom of the cup and tie a paper clip to the end to make a stopper. Repeat with the other end of the string and cup.**



**3. Have a friend take one cup across the room, hold the string tight, and listen for their voice to travel to you through the string telephone. Try different designs by experimenting with different types of string or different types of cups!**





## Dinosaur Footprint Cookies

### Materials List:

- 1 cup of unsalted butter, room temperature
- 1 cup of sugar
- 1 egg
- 1 teaspoon of vanilla extract
- 3 cups of flour
- 2 teaspoons of baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon of salt
- 1 food safe toy dinosaur

**\*This activity should be done with the help of a trusted adult\***

### Instructions:

**1. With the help of an adult, combine the butter and sugar until it's light and fluffy. Mix in the egg, vanilla and set the bowl aside.**



**2. In another bowl, mix the flour, baking powder and salt. Add the flour mixture to the first bowl with butter and combine until it forms a loose dough.**



**3. Place the dough onto a clean surface and knead it until it forms a ball.**



**4. Divide the dough equally into little balls and flatten them with your hands until they're about 1/4" thick. Keep the edges rough so they look like real fossils! Put the cookies on a lined baking sheet, at least 1 inch apart.**



**5. After you've checked with an adult that the toy dinosaur you want to use is food safe, wash and dry the toy, then dust its feet with some flour so that it doesn't stick to the cookies.**



**6. Now it time to get stomping! Press down into the center of the cookie to make a footprint.**



**7. Ask your adult to help you to carefully place the cookie sheet in the oven that's been preheated to 350°F. Let them bake 6-8 minutes. Carefully remove the pan, let them cool and marvel at your delicious dino footprint cookies!**
